
Ancient Orthodox church – associated with St Helen herself – now in the care of Colchester Orthodox Parish

At last – we have St Helen's Chapel! Our first weekend there is 18/19 November in the Year of Grace 2000



This month of November we are honoured to take over one of Colchester's most historic buildings: St Helen's Chapel, Maidenburgh Street. It probably dates from the time of Offa, King of Mercia 758-794, overlord of Essex. Pertainly it was old in 1076: we know that because it needed to be rebuilt that year.

St Helen, Empress of Rome, was a great Christian, attractive in her stature, accomplishments, and holiness. Through the centuries the people of these islands loved her - and claimed she was British, born in Colchester.

The townspeople here held that she was born at the Castle, and that she had actually built this very Chapel where we will worship, though probably it was erected centuries after her time.

At the Reformation it ceased to be used for worship, at various times becoming a school, Quaker meeting-house, and workshop. It has been restored on a number of occasions, the last being in 1886, under the direction of the great architect William Butterfield, when it became a meeting-place for the Anglican Clergy. More recently it has been offices, but for some years now merely a storeroom for the Castle Museum, entirely closed to the public.

Now at the beginning of the third millennium it is being generously handed to us for a period of two ars (possibly extending to four), for the worship of our God and Saviour Jesus Christ – the purpose for which it was built and consecrated, its real and abiding raison d'être.

For this Parish, for the Holy Orthodox cause - and, we believe, for the beautiful and beloved Chapel itself - this is a moment of historic significance.

The year 2000 is indeed a Year of Grace.

God, his Holy Mother, and St Helen, "Patroness of our Parish and City", be praised!

Here's how YOU can help:

Practical work: Turn up to help with:

- Decorating and carpentry (especially constructing the altar floor and iconostasis), if possible immediately we get in there, from Wednesday 8 November at 9.30 am after opening prayers (Contact: DENNIS HINDLE, 01206-868207). Probably this will continue the following week.
- Sewing cloths for the Holy Table, and for Icon stands, etc
- Cleaning, when we need to get ready for worship. Giving: Provide the whole or part cost of an item of your choice or a gift to general costs - in memory of someone special, if you wish:
- Ask for the list of things we must purchase, and decide what item you would like to give.
- Send a cheque, or a promise to pay shortly.

Prayer: Help make this a real place of prayer and true worship:

- Prepare yourself by Confession (before any service)
- If you can, come to some or all the preliminary services below
- Come if you can to the Saturday and Sunday services



ST HELEN'S CHAPEL IS EASY TO FIND It is in Colchester's famous Dutch Quarter, just down the hill behind The George Hotel in the High Street. But mind, streets here are narrow! CAR-PARKING - SUNDAYS ONLY

We been able to arrange Sundays-only parking for worshippers, at Oyster Court, close to the Chapel in St Helen's Lane, by the generosity of the local Mental Health NHS Trust. At other times we shall have to use the public car-parks.


SERVICES AT THE CHAPEL

It is anticipated that Saturday evening and Sunday morning service-times will stay the same.

On most weekdays, either Mattins or Hours, and Vespers will be served - particularly on Wednesday evenings - with Holy Liturgy on great feasts, and possibly one Saturday a month.

It really remains to be worked out in practice. At first, times will be announced only on Sundays: phone if you want to know them.

Obviously, I shall welcome any - Orthodox Faithful or visitors to worship here whenever they can come. No doubt some will sensibly combine "church" with "a bit of shopping"!
