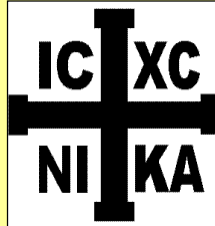

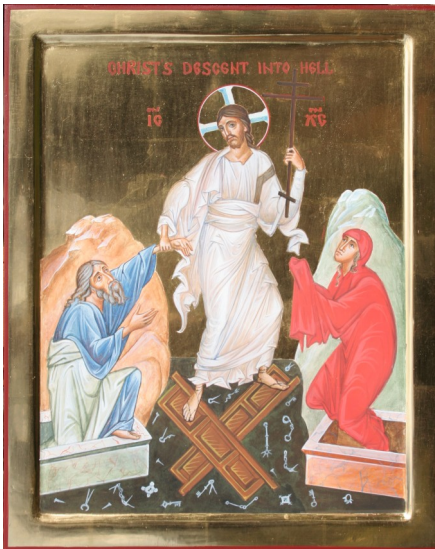
Yes, trouble of one sort or another all around us - yes, and deep within us!

The annual review of parish life

Each year an "annual general meeting" must be held for any public charity, as they are called. So after the Holy Liturgy near the end of March we reviewed the business of running our parish.

Immediately before it this year we had to have an "extraordinary" general meeting to alter a few words in our parish constitution. The two changes - to align our work with Charity Commission requirements - were (a) to the title of the person who examines our accounts, a lady in Ipswich, and (b) to allow proper continuation of Council membership, up from 12 to 15.

It was reported that the numbers for 2018 were: 10 child Baptisms, 2 adult Baptisms, 2 Chrismations, 1 marriage, 1 funeral, average attendance at Sunday Liturgy 39.

The accounts were passed

(still available on the table). Thanks were expressed to everybody with a special job in our parish life. On the Appeal, St Martin's might be ours by September, but more funds are still needed. The lease for St Helen's is surprisingly not finalised.

Elections were carried out. With the new arrangements for membership, the following were appointed Councillors: Khouria Hilary, David Davies, Dusan Radunovic, Theodora Ford, Mary Morris, Teodor Petica, Kalisthene Aristodimou, George Harrison, Jon Kanaar, Nick Taylor, Mark Shillaker, Catalin Fliscu. Paul Lansley asked to retire from the Council, but is still a Trustee. Chairman *ex officio* is Fr Alexander.

Churchwardens, currently David and Dusan, will be elected at the first Council meeting.
