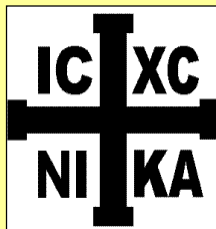

It all appears to be coming together after 25 years. Yes, our trust must be in God, not in ourselves, but it does begin to look as though Christ our God is blessing us to take on St Martin's Church and make it an Orthodox centre in the heart of Colchester!

Early in March our Archbishop, Metropolitan SILOUAN, will come to encourage us in our raising of the last part of the money we need to buy it—it is not a negligible amount. I hope you will do your best to be present to welcome him and share in the meal and entertainment and prayers.

Very shortly here in Colchester we are meeting the present owners, the Churches Conservation Trust, and the Church Commissioners, to discuss purchase arrangements. The present occupiers (an orchestra) finish their lease in July. Our architects are preparing plans to go to the planners soon.

We could be in St Martin's this year - if we raise another £40,000 by the autumn! (If we do not raise the required amount, we do not get the church at all!)

Of course, on top of that there is the cost of heating, which was estimated to be something up to £50,000.

Holy Marriage in Hungary

My trip to Hungary for the wedding of our former Reader MARTIN GROB and his charming bride SZILVIA was a very happy occasion. The service was in the church of St Demetrios in the interesting village Beloianisz originally built for Greek communists who fled their homes after their civil war in 1949. The lovely choir was composed of friends of Martin, and I was honoured to be invited to crown the bride and groom.

Next morning I was asked to celebrate with the local Greek Bishop PAISIOS and was graciously asked to say a short word at the end, which was translated by Martin.

In the evening, in the village of Szizetszentmiklos nearer Budapest, there was a second Liturgy. A new Hungarian-culture parish is being developed in a house, where Martin serves with his Priest, Fr ROBERT. Martin and Szilvia's new home is in fact a new flat on top of this very

lovely church, and he will travel to work in a Budapest museum (studying insects, which is one of the fields of his Master's biology degree: the chef-work he did here was never his proper field).

Somehow, among all these lovely experiences, I was also treated to a visit to a mediaeval Serbian monastery church with amazing frescos and woodwork, a ferry ride across the Danube in the countryside, a tram-ride along the river in Budapest, and a stop at the famous Chain Bridge - in the building of which we think Khouria HILARY's engineering great-great grandfather was involved in the 1840s. I also had time with Fr Robert, his wife and children, his parents and his people. All this in one splendid weekend!

God bless the Bride and Groom and grant them many years! God bless the parish of St Nicholas (Miklos) and its Priest! God bless Hungary!

I was grateful that GEORGE HARRISON met exhausted me at Southend airport!

DONATIONS from the Parish are being sent to local charities **St Helena Hospice, Beacon House, Open Door, and Bernard Brett House.**

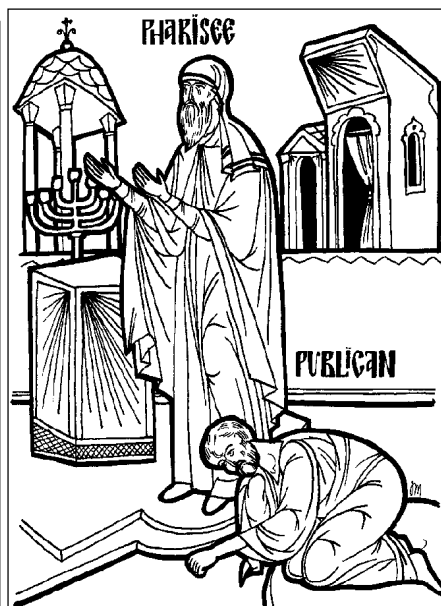
CHILDREN OF ST HELEN: Saturday 2 February 3.15 pm, for primary and pre-school children.

Beginning the Triodion, the Service Book for Lent - Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee, 17 Feb.

This is not the first day of Lent: this year that's 11 March. This is the first day of Pre-Lent—three weeks preparing for our ascetic exercise in the Great Fast.

On **Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee** we are reminded of the need for true repentance, and we *begin* to get right by not fasting at all, even on Wednesday and Friday! This reminds us that fasting without real repentance is useless.

Then on the **Sunday of the Prodigal Son**, we are reminded that repentance is returning to a God who awaits us as a loving Father and welcomes our return, not as one who will beat and assault us.



That week we return to normal fasting rules.

The third Pre-Lent Sunday, of **the Last Judgment**, reminds us that every being will eventually come to be judged by God.

It is also **Meatfare Sunday** - the last day we eat meat until Holy Pascha.

During the days

of that week we do not eat meat, but all other foods we do eat, even on Wednesday and Friday.

The next Sunday is **Forgiveness Sunday**, when at the end of the Liturgy in church we go to the Priest and to each other and ask forgiveness for having sinned against them in any way. That leads to **Clean Monday, the First Day of Lent**. Everything gets more serious in our prayers and daily life. More about that next time!

A Word from the Fathers: St Bede the Venerable (672-735)

Mary said, My soul glorifies the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God, my Saviour.

The Lord, she said, has exalted me with a great and unheard of gift, which cannot be explained in any words and can scarcely be understood by the deepest feelings of the heart. And so I offer up all the strength of my soul in thanksgiving and praise. In my joy I pour out all my life, all my feeling, all my understanding in contemplating the greatness of him who is without end. My spirit rejoices in the eternal

divinity of Jesus my Saviour, whom I have conceived in time and bear in my body.

For he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name.

Mary looks back to the beginning of the canticle, to the words, My soul magnifies the Lord. Only the soul for whom the Lord does great things can glorify and praise him as he deserves; only that soul can call on those who share the same desire and intent. 'Glorify the Lord with me. Together let us praise his name.'
