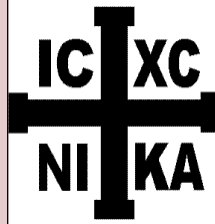

Parish will Appeal for funds to buy St Martin's: we need God's grace!

At Holy Pentecost, fifty days after Pascha, ten after Ascension, **JOY** and **PEACE OF HEART** and **POWER** came upon the Apostles gathered around the Holy Mother of God—see Acts 1 & 2.

They had been praying with her there in the Upper Room, that Christ's promise—to be with them for ever—would be fulfilled. And it was!

This is entirely relevant to us in this Parish at this moment.

The Church Council has decided that we should go ahead with the task of raising money to buy St Martin's Church, just 200 metres away from St Helen's. We have been offered it for £150,000.

This sounds a lot, *is* indeed a lot—but it is rather less than the cost of the average house in Colchester, and is less than the owners have ever asked in our long pursuit of it.

The Council has appointed an Appeal Committee, with Chairman CATALIN FLISCU and Treasurer NICK TAYLOR.

A date to start the Appeal has not as yet been fixed but we hope it will be within a few months.

Metropolitan SILOUAN has sent a second message to the Council and Parish. He says:

What you are doing is asking God to act but whatever comes next will be full of trials, so I ask you all to pray and remain focused, dedicated to overcoming these so that in your weakness Christ's strength will be made manifest!...

Our work for God must be accompanied by faith, so I now ask you all to join together and pray fervently and constantly in the privacy of your own homes as well

as in the community as the body of Christ.

You have given me great joy and I celebrate before Christ your courageous faith. Let this work be blessed and may it glorify God and yourselves.

No doubt you will be as grateful for these words as I am. The full text is available on paper in church or by email: please ask.

It is indeed the message of Pentecost: pray to Christ our God and receive his power, the Holy Spirit, to do his Will.

It fits so closely with the lovely and powerful prayer that Reader ANDREAS wrote for us over a year ago, printed again overleaf. The prayer will be answered by God if it is his Will. I ask you once more to use it in your own prayers as well as in church.

As we celebrate Pentecost this year let us understand ourselves to be open to receive the Power, the Spirit of God in this Parish at this time.

We do need bigger premises. God by his mercy can provide them *if we pray, and work, for his glory.*

St Martin's Appeal—more than £150,000

Details will be worked out over the coming months. It must be for considerably more than the purchase-price of £150,000. The final figure must cover the immediate expense of heating, lighting, and basic adaptation. Also we must find early funding for some of the cost of furnishing an Orthodox temple. St Helen's is 200m down behind the George Hotel in the High Street, but accessible from there only on foot. By car: leave Middleborough Roundabout (between dual carriageways Westway and Balkerne Hill), to Northgate; go straight along St Peter's Street to Castle Park; continue round the bend, up into Maidenburgh Street. The nearest car park is Nunns Road NCP, off St Peter's Street.

Sunday: Mattins 9.45 am (or Hours 10.15 am), Divine Liturgy 10.30 am

Church Council decides to rent St Helen's Chapel for now

The owner of St Martin's is the Churches Conservation Trust in London, but the owner of St Helen's is the Chelmsford Anglican Diocese, so it is complicated!

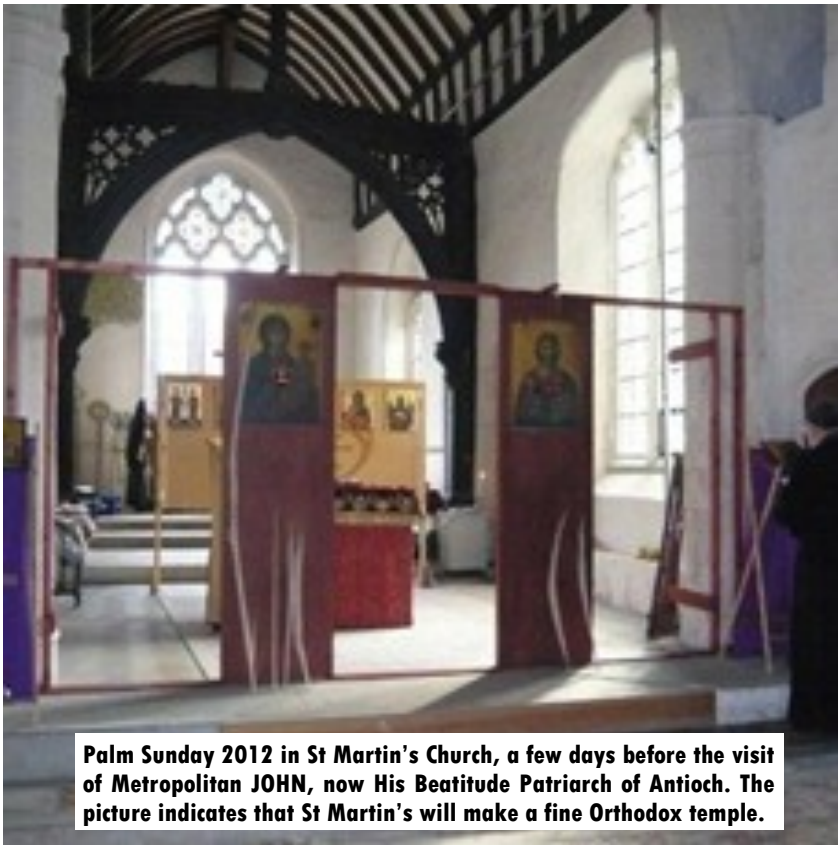
The Church Council has now agreed to rent St Helen's for the sum of £2,000 per year, for at least 5 years. This is a new call on our regular income and giving, a challenge in itself.

For a further 5 years we could have it for a rent to be negotiated. We could purchase St Helen's at some point, if we have enough funding.

This will allow us time to get heating into St Martin's, which is absolutely necessary to help us get rid of any damp there.

So we will expect at the beginning to have summer services in St Martin's, but still to use St Helen's for winter services.

Here and There

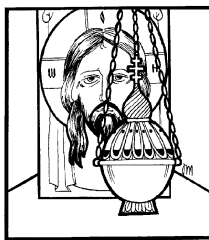
